

# Documents to Confirm Eligibility for Covered California

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Covered California generally accepts self-attestation of information provided by consumers. However if the attestation is inconsistent with the government data sources or other information provided by the individual or in Covered California’s records, the individual must provide documents to support his or her attestation.

If you have received a notice informing you that you have been randomly selected to provide proof of a qualifying life event for a special enrollment period, please refer to the Special Enrollment Period List of Verification Documents.

## Documents to Confirm Eligibility for Covered California

### Identity

1. Driver's license issued by a state or territory showing either a photograph of the individual and/or other identifying information of the individual such as name, age, sex, race, height, weight or eye color
2. School identification card that includes a photograph
3. Voter Registration Card
4. U.S. Military card, draft record or Military dependent's identification card
5. Identification card issued by the Federal, State, or local government that contains a photograph
6. U.S. or foreign passport, U.S. passport card (Expired passport may be used) or identification card issued by a foreign embassy or consulate that contains a photograph
7. Certificate of Naturalization (Form N-550 or N-570) or Certificate of U.S. Citizenship (Form N-560 or N-561)
8. Permanent Resident Card or Alien Registration Receipt Card (Form I-551)
9. Employment Authorization Document that contains a photograph (Form I-766)
10. Native American tribal document with photograph
11. For children under the age of 16:
  - A clinic, doctor, hospital, school record, or
  - in the absence of the previous, a written statement signed under penalty of perjury by the parents or guardian stating date and place of birth (cannot be used in conjunction with a citizenship affidavit)
12. U.S. Coast Guard Merchant Mariner card
13. Finding of identity from a Federal agency or State government agency including but not limited to public assistance, law enforcement, internal revenue or tax bureau, or corrections agency, if the agency has verified and certified the identity of the individual

If the applicant cannot provide a copy of any of the identity documents listed above, the applicant must provide copies of **two (2)** of the following documents:

1. Birth certificate
2. Social Security card
3. Marriage certificate
4. Divorce decree
5. Employer identification card
6. High school or college diploma (including high school equivalency diplomas)
7. Property deed or title document
8. Adoption decree

9. Foreign school record that contains a photograph
10. Notice from public benefits agency
11. Union or worker's center identification card

### Social Security Number

1. Social Security card
2. Tax form(s)
3. Benefit or income statement from Social Security containing the SSN
4. Pending application for an SSN
5. Letter from Social Security stating that the applicant is not eligible for an SSN or is only eligible for a non-work SSN
6. Letter stating that the applicant refuses to obtain an SSN for established religious objections (SSN Waiver)

### Citizenship and U.S. National

#### *Primary (stand-alone) evidence of citizenship*

1. U.S. Passport/ U.S. Passport Card current or expired (issued without limitation)
2. Certificate of U.S. Citizenship
  - Form N-560
  - Form N-561
3. Certificate of Naturalization
  - Forms N-550, N-570,
4. Documentary evidence issued by a federally-recognized American Indian or Alaska Native tribe. Documents must identify the individual by name and confirm the individual's membership, enrollment, or affiliation with a tribe. Documents include but are not limited to:
  - Tribal enrollment card
  - Certificate of Degree of Indian Blood
  - Tribal census document
  - Documents on Tribal letterhead, issued under the signature of the appropriate Tribal official

## Documents to Confirm Eligibility for Covered California

### *Secondary evidence of citizenship*

If an applicant does not have any of the above primary (stand-alone) evidence, **the applicant must provide two documents** (secondary evidence), one from List A and one identity document from List B.

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# Documents to Confirm Eligibility for Covered California

## Immigration Status / Lawful Presence

### *Acceptable Documents for Each Category of Lawfully-Present Immigrants*

**Note: Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) is not an eligible immigration status for health insurance through Covered California. The Employment Authorization Document (I-766) annotated Category “C33” is specific to DACA and is not proof of eligibility for Covered California. Individuals with DACA status may be eligible for Medi-Cal.**

## Documents to Confirm Eligibility for Covered California

5. Certificate of Degree of Indian Blood (CDIB) issued by the Board of Indian Affairs or a tribe, if the CDIB includes tribal enrollment information
6. Letter from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) granting a tribal exemption based on tribal membership or Alaska Native shareholder status

### Annual Income

Note: Self-Attestation of income in a written statement signed under a penalty of perjury is accepted on a case by case basis.

### *Earned Income - Non-Self-Employed Wages*

1. Pay stub. It must include:
  - Full name of the person or other identifying information to link to the person (e.g. SSN). Social Security card is **not** necessary
  - Income amount
  - Pay period or frequency of pay with the date of payment
2. Federal Income Tax Form 1040, 1040NR, 1040A, 1040EZ, 1040X w/original 1040 from previous year, with any appropriate Schedules. It must include:
  - Full name of the person or other identifying information to link to the person (e.g. SSN)
  - Income amount, and
  - Tax year
3. Wages and tax statement (W-2 and/or 1099, including 1099 MISC, 1099G, 1099R, 1099SSA, 1099DIV, 1099SS, 1099INT).
  - It must contain the person's first and last name, income amount, year, and employer name (if applicable)
4. Employer statement
  - Letter or completed form signed by employer which must include:
    - Name of person employed
    - Rate of pay and frequency
    - A signed statement stating "The information provided above is true and correct to the best of my knowledge."
    - Employer signature and date
5. Foreign Income
  - Pay stub, other documents
  - Use dollar conversion based on date of document

## Documents to Confirm Eligibility for Covered California

### *Earned Income - Self-Employment (includes farm income)*

1. Self-employment Profit and Loss Statement or Ledger documentation (the most recent quarterly or year-to-date profit and loss statement, or a self-employment ledger). It must contain:
  - The person's first and last name, company name
  - Dates covered and the net income from profit/loss.
2. Federal Tax Form 1040 with any appropriate Schedules

### *Unearned Income*

1. Annuity statements
2. Statements of pension distribution from any government or private source
3. Prizes, settlements, and awards, including alimony received and court-ordered awards letters
4. Proof of taxable gifts and contributions
5. Proof of taxable scholarships or grants
6. Proof of inheritances in cash or property
7. Proof of strike pay and other benefits from unions
8. Sales receipts or other proof of money received from the sale, exchange or replacement of things the person owns
9. Interests and dividends income statement
10. Royalty or residual income statement or 1099-MISC
11. Letter, deposit, or other proof of deferred compensation payments
12. Social Security Administration Statements (Social Security Benefits Letter)
  - Retirement, Survivors Disability Insurance (RSDI), Social Security Retirement, Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI)
  - It must contain first and last name, benefit amount, and frequency of pay.
13. Unemployment Benefits Letter
  - It must contain the person's first and last name, source/agency, weekly benefits amount, and duration (start and end date, if applicable)

### *Non-Incarceration*

1. Official release papers from the institution or Department of Corrections
2. Parole papers
3. Non-Incarceration Attestation Form

## Documents to Confirm Eligibility for Covered California

### Deceased

#### **Written attestation that the individual is not deceased**

##### Attestation must include:

- Statement from individual that he or she is not deceased
- Statement from the individual that the information provided is true and correct to the best of his or her knowledge
- Date and signature of the individual who was incorrectly identified as being deceased

#### **The following are accepted as proof of death:**

1. Copy of Death Certificate
2. Bureau of Vital Statistics records
3. Widow or survivor's benefits on the deceased individual's Social Security number (SSN)
4. Veterans Administration or military service records
